“You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up.” Deuteronomy 6:5-7

As I meditate on this foundational Scripture, my mind goes back many years to a small brown booklet I was given titled “Ministering to the Lord”. This tiny booklet, only a few pages long, stressed time and time again that the focus of our hearts, souls and strength must be on the LORD first, the God of Israel.

God commands us to keep this loving focus on Him in our hearts, and so the question I pose to myself is: *Why?* There are indeed many reasons; however, because of His limitless loving-kindness, may I suggest that one of the main reasons is that God has it on His own heart to bless us!

“You will keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on You, because he trusts in You.” Isaiah 26:3.

An intentional, single focus. For those who believe in the unerring Word of God, this attitude has always been appropriate, but in these days, this focus is essential not only for our own well-being, but also for the comfort and wellbeing of the Jewish people whom the LORD is calling us to comfort and assist as they make their way home to Eretz Yisrael.

The prophet Isaiah’s statement that “Truth has fallen in the streets” could easily have been written in our day, and it is now our privilege and responsibility to make sure that we proclaim the truth of God’s Word to all who will listen.

The above Scripture from Deuteronomy makes it clear that the starting point for

proclaiming the truths of Scripture is to our own families first, teaching them diligently, frequently and consistently.

As I ponder this commandment, it starts to become clearer that for those called to help the Jewish people make *aliyah*, the word “children” not only relates to blood relatives, but also to all those whom the LORD is calling to take up the baton going forward: **The Next Generation**. Speaking with, encouraging, and challenging the Next Generation is clearly a command from Scripture, and in my experience can be carried out in a number of ways:

1. **Praying for the LORD to raise up the Next Generation.**
2. **Facilitating engagement with others of like mind.**
3. **Creating opportunities to volunteer and even speak at meetings, conferences etc.**
4. **Walking alongside those who are passionate about God’s heart and plans for the Jewish people, and guiding them.**

In writing this article, I am amazed at the LORD’s timing. During this morning’s service at our church, the pastor had each generation stand one by one (three in total). She then spoke an encouraging yet challenging word over each generation (for my generation it was to pray fervently for the younger generations), and finally each generation prayed for a different generation in small groups. **This is my heart’s desire for the generations in the Ebenezer family!**

I believe with all my heart that we need to be bold and intentional whenever we get the opportunity to share about God’s plans for *aliyah*, and to this end I have personally been challenged to bring more of a sense of urgency when sharing the Scriptures about *aliyah*, whether to ones, twos or in larger

KEY WORDS

Aliyah is the word for the immigration of Jewish people from the Diaspora to the Land of Israel. The word in Hebrew means ascent and is defined as ‘going up’ – progressing towards Jerusalem.

Olim means Jewish immigrants to Israel – those making aliyah. In the singular, a male immigrant is called an **oleh** and a female immigrant an **olah**. Potential olim are those our teams contact and encourage to make aliyah.

Klitch concerns the absorption of olim after they have arrived in Israel. It includes all aspects of integrating into society, including learning Hebrew, finding employment and housing, and school enrolment.

gatherings. Often-times this takes the form of showing a poster from 1914, where in the UK the then War Minister Lord Kitchener points to everyone in the country with a clear message that you can read below.

Although I didn't realise it at the time, for me, this call came about ten years ago through a prophetic act, challenging me to step up as a member of the Next Generation at that time. At an International Conference, a UK supporter placed his jacket upon my shoulders, indicating not just the passing on of a baton as in a relay race, but also as a sign of different generations working together.

I recently heard a phrase, "synergy of the ages" which spoke to me deeply with regard to the *aliyah* and the unity and interconnectivity amongst the generations. It is exciting to think that synergy in this sense would be us simply working together to achieve something greater than anything we could achieve on our own. In the context of Ebenezer, it would also mean coming

into agreement with the promises given to those who have gone before us in prayer.

As we pray and work together in unity within our own nations and between nations, then I believe that such an agreement allows God to multiply His power in releasing His promises for the *aliyah*. Let us "see" the Next Generation that the LORD is raising up, walk alongside them, prophetically "put our jackets" on them and pray for them to receive a double portion anointing for the work that lies ahead!

May we not be like the Moabitess Orpah, who departed from Naomi and went back home, but instead may we be like Ruth ("friend" in Hebrew) who was committed and faithful in her generation; a true friend who became the great-grandmother of King David!

"Don't urge me to leave you or to turn back from you. Where you go I will go, and where you stay I will stay. Your people will be my people and your God my God." Ruth 1:16

Thank you for your prayers for our small team in the world's largest country! Thanks to your support, the largest aliyah has been carried out from our country for decades.

In 1996, our family graduated from a Bible school and became missionaries in a big city in the Far East of our country. The Lord helped us to open a church there, which, within six months had more than 150 members!

After just over a year, God opened the doors for us to serve the Jews of the Far East in their return to Israel. This was very new for us, but gradually God revealed His heart for the Jewish people to us. At that time, we were sending over 500 Jews to Israel every week. Every evening we arranged farewell parties to encourage them in their decision to make *aliyah*.

We soon noticed that many of our pastor friends started avoiding us; some even called us traitors. I didn't understand why this was happening until I discovered a book which dealt with the history of antisemitism in the Church. I could not believe that Church history was filled with pages written in Jewish blood!

After learning more about this, we began to ask for forgiveness for the sins of

our spiritual fathers from Jews leaving for Israel during farewell parties.

The topics of *aliyah* and historical Christian antisemitism became our main message with which we have come to almost every Christian community in the Far East and other regions.

In 2010, leaders of Jewish and Christian communities gathered at the Memorial Synagogue in our capital. There, Christians prayed for repentance for the historical antisemitism of the Church, after which both sides agreed to begin a Jewish-Christian dialogue – not of words, but of deeds.

Together, Christians and Jews began to erect monuments at sites of wartime mass killings. Over 15 years, more than 100 memorials have been established. Christians also support survivors of ghettos and camps, as well as Jewish communities. We realised **our deeds speak louder than words**. Hundreds of evangelical communities now join annual prayer marathons on Holocaust Memorial Day; this year, 527 took part in the sixth.

Today, all evangelical denominations support this ministry. Behind it, we see God turning hearts – Jews and Christians – to each other.

At the first Shavuot, God gave Israel the Torah — His commandments (*Exodus 19–20*). On Pentecost in 28 C.E., He gave His Holy Spirit to the disciples of Jesus (*Acts 2:1–4*), fulfilling the promise to write His law on their hearts (*Jeremiah 31:33; 2 Corinthians 3:3*). What began as external instruction became inward transformation through His Spirit.

Our conference will focus on encouraging the Church to embrace the message of aliyah — the prophetic return of the Jewish people (*Isaiah 11:11–12; Jeremiah 16:14–16*). THROUGH FIVE COUNTRIES TO ISRAEL

Thus says the Lord God: "Behold, I will lift My hand in an oath to the nations, and set up My standard for the peoples; They shall bring your sons in their arms, and your daughters shall be carried on their shoulders" Isaiah 49:22

This is the story of Alexei and Elena and their three sons, Andrei (16), Kirill (14), and Daniil (11). It required much faith and strength to make the journey to Israel. Their journey and the involvement of different volunteers and organisations remind us that in the difficult moments of life, there are always people who are ready to support and carry us.

The family left home for Turkey and later moved to Kyrgyzstan with the intention of eventually moving to Israel. At the beginning of the summer, they travelled to Uzbekistan to visit the consulate and obtain Israeli visas. After receiving the visas, Elena contacted the Jewish Agency (JA) in Kazakhstan to purchase tickets to Israel. Through them, she learned about Ebenezer and wrote to me asking for support.

In Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan, we have volunteer fishermen and prayer warriors who have been serving the Jewish people for 12 years. I asked

Pavel to arrange transportation to the airport. The family was very grateful to Pavel's team for their help and care.

On 27 July, Alexei and Elena flew with their children to Uzbekistan. There, they were met at the airport by the JA, who put them up in a hotel until morning and then flew with them to Tel Aviv. They were welcomed in Israel, registered, and offered temporary accommodation.

A new chapter in their lives began: learning Hebrew, adapting and settling in. Alexei works remotely in IT, while Elena writes scripts for interactive excursions. Together with a team, she planned a walking tour along Neve Tzedek in Tel Aviv.

Elena's parents, her sister, and her brother-in-law plan to move to Israel in the future. Her father is a paediatrician, but they need to sell their property and finish some business.

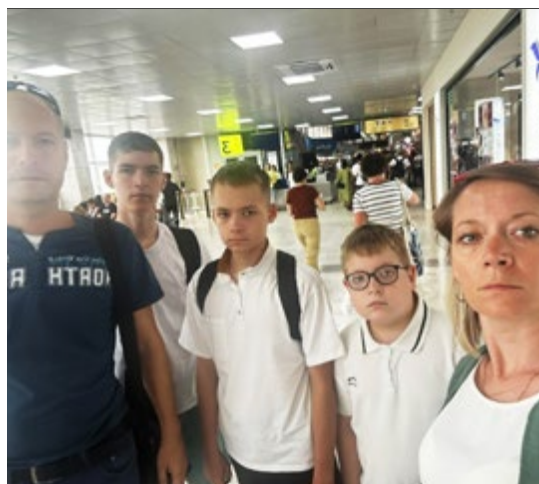
We thank the God of Israel for His mercy and grace and for answering our prayers.

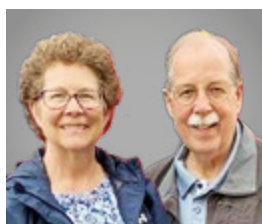

Regrettably, we returned to the US in 2022 for family reasons. That autumn, a door opened for us to go to Jerusalem to oversee a house of prayer, and our relationship with the EOE Israel team prospered.

After a visa break in the States, we purchased flights to return to Israel on 18 October 2023, only to watch in horror as October 7 unfolded. Our flights were cancelled. For months we continued to pray, hope and prepare – keenly feeling the discouragement and struggle that so many of the *olim* have experienced.

Finally, we returned to Israel in February 2024. During our stay, we helped with various tasks, and led our Young Adults Solidarity Tour in May, which served from Gaza to the Lebanese border.

Larry's growing weakness revealed a heart valve requiring surgery, so we returned to the US. Once recovered, we prepared to return to Israel. But before we could buy flights, the war with Iran erupted. Our disappointment was short-lived. Johannes

called to ask us to come and help the EOE Poland team. We prayed, sensed a "yes", bought flights, and arrived two weeks later.

Our work, like all Ebenezer operations everywhere, starts with daily prayer. Here in the house at the Polish-Ukrainian border, we host Jewish families en route to Israel – preparing beds, meals, cleaning, and laundry. **It's practical prophetic work.**

Departure from Ukraine is only by train. So we meet the *olim* at the border and take them on the long drive to Warsaw's airport. Overnight hotel stays are often needed for early flights.

Recently, we transported a family of four from Dnipro, along with their cat and German Shepherd. There were traffic delays, a last-minute scramble for a dog crate, but – with God's help – everything came together.

While in Warsaw, we also visit Jewish families awaiting *aliyah* paperwork – offering encouragement, assessing needs, buying groceries, and praying with them.

Thank you for your prayers! With God's help, the obstacles are overcome. Keep partnering with us in His work in bringing His people home to His land.

FISHING BRINGS FRUIT

I have heard several times now that some people in Europe are growing tired of this war. But what about us, those who live under constant missile and drone attacks? What about those in cities like Sumy, Kharkiv, or Kherson?

Local residents there endure relentless strikes, targeting even pedestrians walking to the market or someone riding a bike to work.

When I visited Kherson, my hometown, where I lived for about 20 years, I could hardly recognise it. It was a warm Sunday evening, yet the streets were nearly empty. Daily attacks had forced many to flee. Once a city of 300,000, Kherson now has only about 67,000 residents, most of them elderly, and risks being abandoned altogether.

Troops scatter anti-personnel “petal” mines by drones, creating deadly hazards for civilians. Recently, drones began striking civilian cars and lorries carrying food. With so many businesses closed, checkpoints everywhere, and the constant threat of forced conscription, this is the grim reality of life in a frontline city.

In such circumstances, food parcels are more than acts of kindness – they

are vital support for Jewish families. Elderly men and women, who thought they were forgotten, were deeply moved to hear that the God of Israel has not forsaken them.

We are grateful for the chance to bless Jewish people in Ukraine with food, which also opens doors for us to share the Word of God. Through these fishing trips, we can help more Jewish families return home to Israel.

Recently, I had the privilege of helping a family of five from Kharkiv and a family of two from Poltava region. Our team had earlier visited Olexandr, an elderly man in Kharkiv recovering from a heart attack and cancer, and his wife Larisa, bringing them a food parcel and speaking with them about *aliyah*. Later, Larisa called to ask for help in traveling to Kishinev for visas and a flight to Israel. We brought them, along with their son Stas’s family and another couple from Kremenchuk, to Vinnytsia.

What joy it was to see this outreach bear fruit for the God of Israel! **Let us continue praying** for Olexandr’s healing, and for these families to be rooted in the land of their forefathers and come to know the Lord.

"Who are these who fly like a cloud, and like doves to their roosts?" Isaiah 60:8

France is the European country with the largest Jewish community. In recent years, we have seen an unprecedented rise in antisemitism, causing many Jewish people not only to consider *aliyah* as an option, but literally to try to leave as quickly as possible. On 12 August 2025, the Jewish Agency, with the support of Christians for Israel and Ebenezer, conducted a group *aliyah* flight from Paris with 63 *olim*.

Originally, the flight was planned for 25 *olim*. Then, a few days before departure, we were told that 50 would be coming, and finally, 63 *olim* took part. Over the summer there are usually many families making *aliyah* so they can arrive in Israel before the new school year begins.

Our Israel team prepared a warm welcome for the *olim* with welcome cards, sweets, and balloons. The flight was a visible sign that the joint effort of Christians together with our Jewish friends can make a difference and bring encouragement, hope, and comfort to the Jewish people fleeing antisemitism.

The Jews coming to Israel are not refugees; they are coming home, 'going up' – that is what *aliyah* means. It was

wonderful to see many of the *olim* offering their first prayer at the airport. You could literally see their excitement at becoming part of one of the greatest miracles since the exodus from Egypt.

As much as it is a shame that Jews in Europe no longer feel safe – and that only 80 years after the Holocaust they once again must find a place where they can live their Jewish life in freedom – we must also admit that God uses antisemitism to strengthen His people in the Promised Land. These new immigrants will help build the land, as foretold by the prophets.

Our prayer is that many more will follow, and that the Lord enables us to support them with more flights and practical help on the ground. Our French team has been receiving increasing requests to assist *olim* before their flights. We appreciate all the support in prayer and donations for the French *aliyah*.

A PLACE OF REFUGE

From antiquity to the modern era, Cypriots and the Jewish people have shared a long and rich history of interaction, sometimes in trade and at other times as refugees seeking safety. Separated by the Mediterranean Sea at a distance of 144 nautical miles, the two countries have remained connected through the events of history.

Since 722 BC, Cyprus has intermittently been the home and refuge of a Jewish community. As early as 30-36 AD, Cyprus was used as a place of refuge for persecuted Jewish believers after the stoning of Stephen (Acts 11:19).

Subsequently, in the late 1940s, a unique bond was forged between the Cypriots and the Jewish people as Holocaust survivors were interned in British camps on the island. The local Cypriots went to great lengths to assist the detainees.

In continuance of its call, thousands of stranded Israeli travellers were hosted on the island during the 12-day Israel/Iran war in June, when many flights were diverted to Cyprus, until they could safely return to Israel by plane and by ship.

A hotel owner in the Troodos mountains extended free hospitality to stranded Israelis until they could safely travel home.

Two members of the Ebenezer Cyprus team, Jack and Debbie Holford, offered two free sailings to needy Israelis on their yacht.

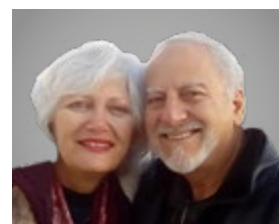
Israel in its turn has extended military expertise including the Iron Dome air defence system to Cyprus, which is so important as Cyprus does not have an efficient defence capability of its own. We are very grateful to the Lord for this continuing growing friendship between the two countries.

It has to be said, however, that the Cyprus government unfortunately supports a two-state solution for Israel and is against Israeli settler housing development. In addition, the local media is not conveying the whole truth concerning the situation in Gaza, which unfortunately is contributing to a more hostile atmosphere towards the Jewish community on the island.

Let us pray that:

- ✓ Cyprus will remain a good neighbour and a safe place of refuge for *aliyah*. (Zechariah 8:16)
- ✓ The Cyprus government will repent and turn from its policy of supporting a two-state solution for Israel.

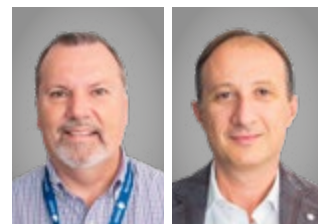

Ebenezer Operation Exodus remains steadfast in its calling to serve the Jewish people. Amid uncertainty, one of the greatest needs for new *olim* (immigrants) is a safe and welcoming place to call home.

Over the past year, our two houses in Haifa and Ashdod have provided not only shelter but also community, encouragement, and the reassurance of God's faithfulness.

Each immigrant carries a story of courage and resilience, and Ebenezer is privileged to share in that journey.

At Haifa House, new arrivals often come weary from long journeys and the upheaval of leaving behind everything familiar. Here, they are welcomed with open arms and given the space to rest, breathe, and adjust to life in the Land. House managers and volunteers offer both practical help and a listening ear, walking alongside each person in the first critical days of their new beginning.

In Ashdod, Beit Yonah, our newest house, opened on 1 January 2025. A steady stream of *olim* has already come through its doors. From pregnant women to those scarred by antisemitic attacks, many have found a secure place to start afresh in Beit Yonah. It has quickly become a refuge of stability and hope.

Amongst much other work, in Ashdod, every bedroom has air conditioning, railings have been installed for safety, and an accessible ensuite room has been created for wheelchair users. In Haifa, a new security wall now protects residents. This work could not have been done without your prayers and faithful giving. Thank you!

Looking ahead to 2026, the need for such homes will only increase. The call of *aliyah* continues, and with it comes the challenge of providing safe, well-maintained houses where new arrivals can land and find their footing.

We are thankful that most families evacuated from the North during the war with Hezbollah have now returned to their homes. Our cooperation with the Mayor's Office in Jerusalem during this time was a privilege, and we hope to continue visiting these families in their towns.



Our vision is to be servants and intercessors of the Lord, to help the Jewish people return to the land of Israel from all the nations and to proclaim God's Kingdom purposes for their return.

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Operation Exodus is the operational part of Ebenezer Emergency Fund International. Started in 1991 with just three people, it now has representatives in 50 countries worldwide.



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
